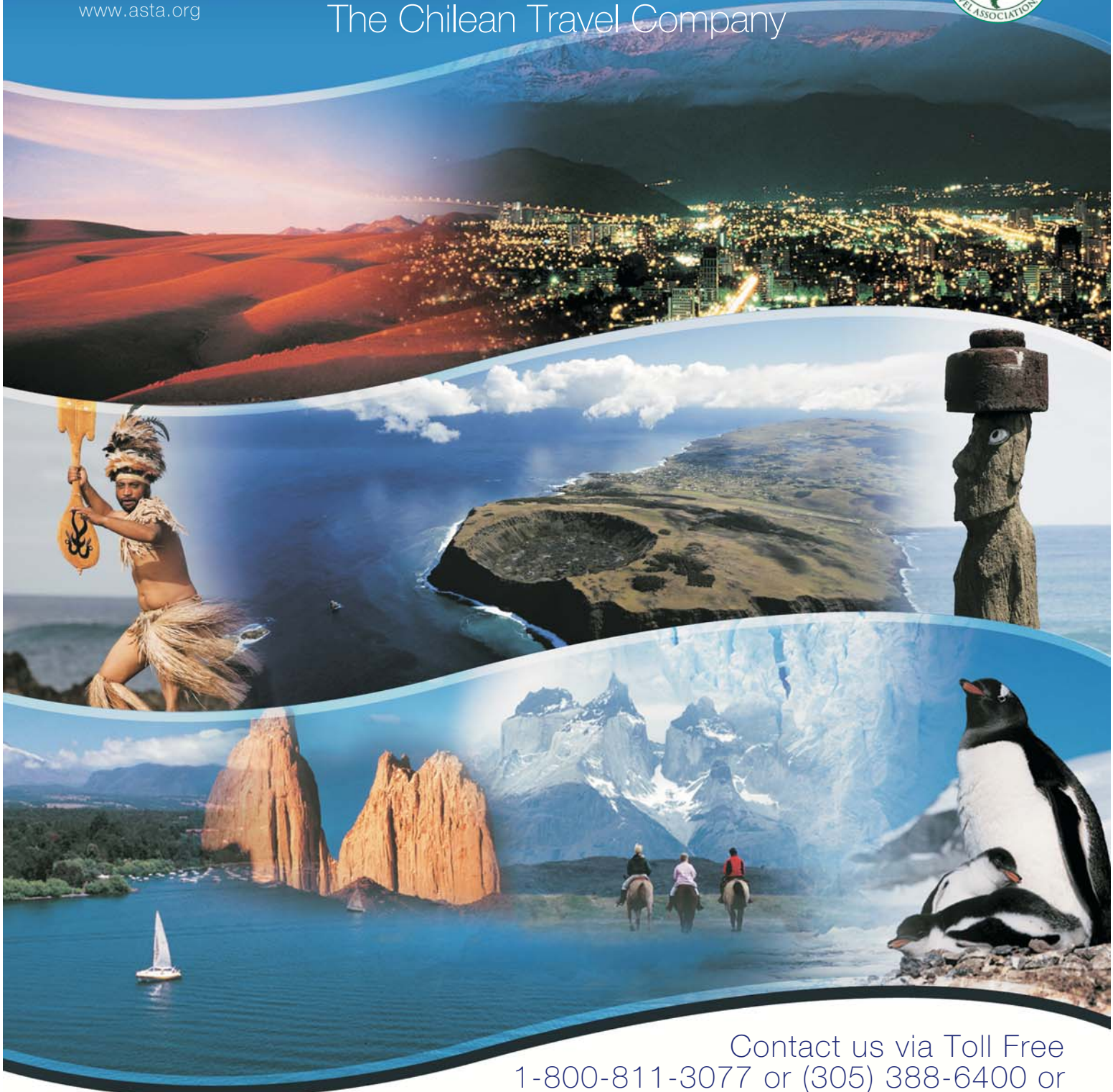




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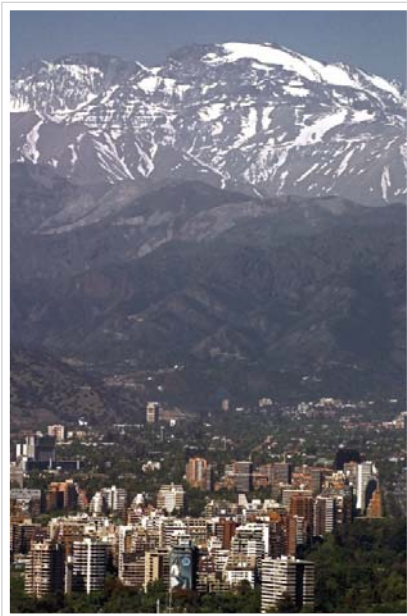
Recommend Travel Plan for Santiago Valparaíso Viña del Mar and Wineries Valley

4 Days / 3 Nights

Day 1: Santiago

Arrival to Santiago airport and transfer to the Hotel for Half Day Santiago City Tour.

In the afternoon departure for a comprehensive city tour of Santiago. We will start the tour at the San Francisco Church, which was built between 1572 and 1618. Then we will continue West visiting the "Club Hípico" horse-racing course, which is considered one of the most beautiful



courses in South America. We will then pass the Palacio de la Moneda, current seat of government. Then we will visit the Plaza de Armas, where we will see important National Monuments, such as the Iglesia Catedral (The Cathedral Church), Correo Central (The Main Post Office) and the Municipalidad de Santiago (The City Hall). We will continue our trip going to the Cerro Santa Lucía (the Santa Lucía Hill), where the city was founded in 1541. We will cross the Mapocho river and pass through different residential districts giving us an overview of the city. Return to the hotel in Santiago. Overnight.

Day 2: Viña del Mar and Valparaíso Pier

Full Day Valparaíso - Vina del Mar and Stop in Casablanca Wineries Valley This full day tour starts from the hotel. Half way to Valparaíso, we can observe the variety of scenery and vegetation in the

Curacaví and Casablanca valleys, as well as the Coastal mountain range. Arriving to Valparaíso, the main commercial port of Chile, we will see clusters of houses built along the hills. On one of the hills is "La Sebastiana", the former home of the Nobel Prize winning poet, Pablo Neruda, and which houses a wide collection of his brick a brac. We will pass the National Congress building and then drive along Pedro Montt Avenue, from where we can see the Italian Park, Victoria Square and the Cathedral. On the Brasil Avenue we will see the British Arch, the Regional Government Building and the statue to Lord Cochrane. Places of interest are the Floral Clock, the Abarca Cove, the Arab Union Club, Wulff Castle, the Marga-Marga estuary, the Municipal Casino, Peru Avenue, Acapulco beach and Vergara Quay. Our trip continues along the coast passing the beaches of The Marines, as well as Las Salinas, Reñaca and Cochoa beaches and up to the sea-wolf viewing point. We will then stop for lunch. We will then return to the center of Viña del Mar, from where we get right into downtown Viña del Mar, where we will find the Francisco Vergara Square, the Municipal Theatre and Sucre Square. Return to the hotel in Santiago or Hotel in Vina del Mar or Valparaíso. Overnight.

Day 3: Colchagua Wineries Valley

Full Day Santa Cruz Colchagua Wineries Valley Departure from hotel towards the Colchagua Valley, one of the most fertile valleys in Chile, dedicated mostly to fruit and wine production. In Santa Cruz, we will visit one of the many wineries in this valley, with the opportunity of visiting their facilities and tasting their wines.

After a delicious lunch at the Santa Cruz hotel, visit to the Colchagua Museum, one of the most important private museum in



Chile and the largest in Latin America. It has a great collection of pre-Columbian items, religious imagery, silver articles of Mapuche people, carriages and farm machinery; it also has a big collection of insects. Arrival to Santa Cruz hotel, where a glass of wine will be waiting for our welcome drink. overnight in Hotel Santa Cruz or Los Lingues.

Day 4: Santiago

Depart from Santiago Chile At the agreed time private transfer to the airport for the departure flight.



Recommend Travel Plan for Punta Arenas / Puerto Natales and Torres del Paine National Park

5 Days / 4 Nights

Day 1: Punta Arenas

Pick up your car at the airport or downtown rental office. Punta Arenas is the largest and most important city of Chilean Patagonia. It is located on the western side of the Strait of Magellan and its inhabitants come from a mix of cultural backgrounds. To get acquainted with Punta Arenas, start on Mirador Hill, which offers an expansive view of the Strait of Magellan & Tierra del Fuego, and the city itself. Continue on to the city's main streets and avenues and the Plaza Muñoz Gamero, which features a monument to Magellan and a border of grand mansions and homes. Visit the Salesiano Regional Museum, which superbly documents the history of the region and the lives of the Yagane, Ona, Alacalufe peoples in particular. Overnight in Punta Arenas.

Day 2: Punta Arenas / Puerto Natales / Torres del Paine

It will be a rather long drive to Torres del Paine National Park with many interesting stops on the way; you will be able to visit the Penguin Colony on the Otway Sound, for example. The main road to Puerto Natales is paved and in good conditions. Puerto Natales was founded in 1911 and today it's one of the most important urban centers in Patagonia. Located in the north side of the region, between the Pacific Ocean and Argentina, Puerto Natales has marvelous geography with different geographic formations such as valleys, fjords, archipelagos and millenary ice fields. Its irregular weather conditions allow the visitor to practice tourism activities. It's a city with an incredible architecture and natural landscapes. Attractions Flora and fauna. Colorful architecture and hand made crafts. Places that stand out are Muelle Pescadores



Artesanales, Arturo Prat Square –with pine trees and poplar trees-, Parroquial Church –built at the beginning of the 20th century-, street paintings that show the native population's history, Salesiano Museum and Pueblo Artesanal sheep farms are scattered along the way. After Puerto Natales Torres del Paine National Park will welcome you from afar with its gigantic granite towers. Overnight in Torres del Paine National Park. (B)

Day 3: Torres del Paine National Park World Biosphere Reserve by the UNESCO in 1978

The National Park Torres del Paine is one of the most impressive parks in Chile because of its unique wildlife and dramatic scenery. The park is best known for its steep granite towers (torres), the unique horns (cuernos) and the Big Paine Mountain. The massif is crowned by glaciers and surrounded by cascading rivers and beautiful emerald lakes. In the Park there are many hiking trails to choose from to discover this gorgeous park.

Tours options in the Park :

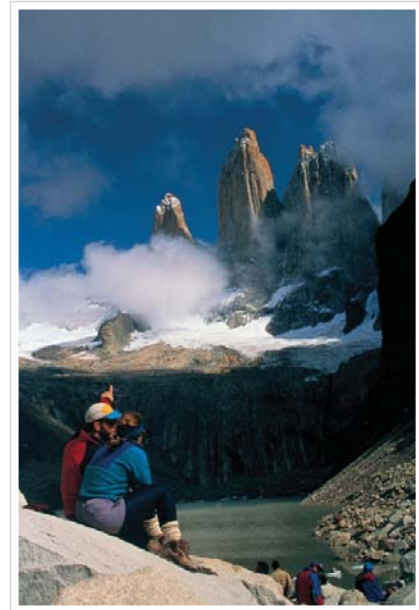
Option 1 : Basic Torres del Paine

An departure from hotel to connect with a trip to Torres del Paine National Park, where we will have a nice panoramic view of Paine Mountain as welcome. Also we will admire lakes as Sarmiento, Nordenskjold and Pehoe. Its fauna will be present through huanacos and foxes, among others, and big variety of birds of easy observation during the trip. A short trek will take us to a big waterfall called Salto Grande, which is part of park hydrographical net. Later, retaking the main way, it access to CONAF central office, to continue to Lake Grey, where after to walk (30 minutes) through a millenium forest, we will get to its beach to admire a great number leading off floes from glacier. Overnight in Torres del Paine National Park.

Option 2 : Trekking to Base of the Towers

Breakfast. Depart from Hostería to start our guided excursion to the footsteps of Torres del Paine (there are optional tours). It's a trek of 8 hours (high exigence) following the Ascencio River towards the Ascencio Valley by trail paths through beech forests. After crossing the forest we will start the last part of trekking ascending a huge big rocks moraine produced by glacier action. If weather conditions allow it you will be a privileged visitor who can admire these three giant granite towers (South, Central and North towers) and Torres snow-drift. After 1 hour being awed by the landscape we will start our return following the same path back to Hostería. A box lunch type is

included. Overnight in Torres del Paine National Park.



Day 4: Torres del Paine / Puerto Natales

Today you will be able to spend the morning and early afternoon in the national park and explore the places you have not seen yet. Drive back to Puerto Natales in the afternoon; do not forget to visit the Milodón Cave where scientists discovered the remains of a gigantic sloth. Overnight in Puerto Natales.

Day 5: Puerto Natales or Punta Arenas

1 extra overnight in Puerto Natales or return to Punta Arenas Airport or Hotel

Optional Tours in Puerto Natales Balmaceda and Serrano Glacier

From the dock in Puerto Natales, board the ship to cruise through the Seno de Ultima Esperanza (Last Hope Sound). The exquisite Patagonia landscape unfolds along the way. Be sure to glance back for a breathtaking view of Puerto Natales surrounded by imposing mountains. Disembark at the dock in front of Serrano Glacier and take a short walk for a closer look at the glacier's ice walls. Back on the ship, proceed to Balmaceda Glacier, which appears to hang from statately, snowy peaks. Return to Puerto Natales.

Recommend Travel Plan for Temuco - Pucon and Puyehue 5 Days / 4 Nights

Day 1 : Temuco / Mapuche Land

Reception at the Airport and transfer to Hotel. Temuco is the ninth region's capital and the main urban center in the area. Located between the Conun Huenu and Nierol Hills, Temuco is the main urban center for economical, administrative and cultural activities. With 200,000 habitants, the regional capital was founded in 1881 to hold the native Indians attacks. Attractions Flora and fauna. Important urban

center. Historical and cultural interest zone.

Pm departure for Mapuche cultural tour visiting the Kilaleufu Indian housing and tasting samples of the traditional Mapuche food. Inside the house, a Mapuche woman will tell the visitors typical stories about the craftsmanship, customs, looms and their special way of life. Overnight in Temuco.

Day 2 : Temuco / Pucon / Villarica

Transfer from Temuco to Pucon, about a 1 hour drive. Pucon is a city and a bathing resort in the Araucania, home of 10,000 people. Located in the Villarica lake shore, today it's an



and town of the same name. The volcano is also known as Rucapillán, a Mapuche word meaning "House of the Pillán". Ride about half way up to the volcano. It stands nearly 9,000 feet, enjoying lush vegetation, numerous waterfalls and spectacular panoramic views of the entire region. Have a hearty picnic lunch, then descend by bike. Return to Pucon. Overnight in Pucon.

Others options: Trekking Huerquehue National Park or Rafting in Caburga River

Day 4: Pucon / Puyehue Natural Hot Sping

Transfer or Car Rental from Pucon via the scenic backroad route through Puyehue the town on the lake of the same name. It is a 4 hour drive Overnight in Termas Puyehue Wellness & SPA Resort is located in Los Lagos Region of Chile at the side of Los Andes mountain chain; situated next to the unspoiled Puyehue National Park, a 107,000 ha natural sanctuary of beautiful forests, rivers, lakes and named biosphere reserve by UNESCO. Overnight in Puyehue

Day 5 : Puyehue to Puerto Varas or Puerto Montt or Regular Bus to Bariloche Argentina .

important tourism center, with a great infrastructure. Attractions LakeBeaches, outdoor activities. Horseback ridings, alas delta, sport fishing, banana, bungee, bicycle ridings, aquatic ski, sailing, parapente, surf, windsurf, picnic, swimming, flora and fauna contemplation, photography. In then afternoon we will depart for a bike ride into the forest to Ojos del Caburga, or Caburgua's Eyes, a mysterius group of pools by the nearby a Caburgua Lake through underground channels. Overnight in Pucon.

Day 3: Villarica Volcano

Full day excursion to one of Chile's most active volcanoes Villarica , rises above the lake





Recommend Travel Plan to San Pedro de Atacama

4 Days / 3 Nights

Day 1: Calama San Pedro Quito / Valley of the Moon

Arrival to Calama. Reception at the airport and transfer to San Pedro de Atacama.

On route we will see the Cordillera de la Sal (Salt mountain range) and the only view of the massive salt flat with the Licancabur volcano in the background. Arrival to the hotel in San Pedro de Atacama. In the afternoon we will visit the Archaeological Museum Padre Le Paige where we will witness an exhibition showing the evolution



of Atacamanian life over the last 11000 years. We will then visit the town church, The Main Square, the house of Pedro de Valdivia (a conquistador and the founder of Santiago). We will then visit the Pukará de Quito. In the afternoon we will take an excursion to the Valle de la Luna (Valley

of the Moon), famous world wide for its "lunar" appearance, the salt caverns, the Tres Marias (Three Marys) rock formations and the great dune from where we will witness a spectacular sunset. Return to the hotel in San Pedro de Atacama. Overnight.

Day 2: San Pedro de Atacama / Toconao / Miscante & Miñique Lagunes / San Pedro

Breakfast at the hotel. Full day excursion (with box lunch included) visiting the village of Toconao with its interesting liparite stone buildings, and then on to the Atacama salt flat where we will visit the Famingo National Reservation, a habitat of 3 of the most beautiful species of flamingo. We will then

head for the altiplanic lakes of Miscante and Miñique at over 4000 meters (over 13000 feet) above sea level. Finally we will head for the Aguas calientes salt flat and the impressive Tuyajto lagoon. Return to the hotel in San Pedro de Atacama. Overnight.

Day 3: San Pedro

Free day in San Pedro to relax

Day 4: San Pedro / Tatio Geysers / Calama

Early morning departure for the Tatio Geysers to experience this spectacular demonstration of volcanic activity. We will also visit the village of Caspana with its fertile terraces, architecture in Liparita stone and characteristic mud-roofs. We will continue with visits to the villages of Toconce and Vegas de Turi on an awe inspiring route which takes us through Chiu-Chiu and Lasana, with their important cultural and historical legacies including one of the oldest and most beautiful churches in Chile. Box lunch on route. We will arrive to Calama in the afternoon. Transfer to the airport for the departure flight.



Recommend Travel Program for Easter Island Rapa Nui

4 Days / 3 Nights

Day 1: Hanga Roa

Welcome to Easter Island and Transfer to Hanga Roa Arrival to Easter Island. Reception at Mataverí Airport with flower and/or shell necklaces. Transfer to the hotel. Lodging.

Day 2: Hanga Roa / Anakena / Hanga Roa

Breakfast at the hotel. A full day tours, along the easter island Moai route, visiting: Vaihu, a place which is surrounded by enormous statues which have fallen face down; the ruins of Akahanga, which are in their natural condition and where the first king of the island was buried. We will see the Rano Raraku volcano, and at the base of Poike, which is the most spectacular crater in the zone and where the former island-people carved the giant statues from the volcano's quarry. Here we can see the different stages in the construction of the Moais, the biggest of which still remains at the base of the quarry and which is more than 20m long and weighs just under 200 tons. We carry on towards the beautiful beach of Anakena, where we will see Ahu Tongariki, which was the biggest of the 15 Moais on the island. They weighed an average of 50 tons and were destroyed by a tidal wave in 1960. Lunch Box and free time to enjoy the warm sea waters. In the afternoon, return to the hotel. Overnight.

Day 3: Hanga Roa / Orongo / Hanga Roa

Breakfast at the hotel. A half-day tour to Orongo, visiting the Rano Kao volcano,



whose deep crater of lush vegetation contains a large fresh water lake covered with totora. >From there, we will continue onto the Cultural Centre of Orongo, situated at the top of the crater at over 300m above sea level and where year after year the Bird Man or Tangata Manu ceremony takes place. We can see more than 100 petroglyphs which represent the Make-Make God and the Manutara seabird amongst others. Next, we will proceed to Ana Kai Tangata. Then we will visit Ahu Vinapu, where the interesting architectural style reminds you of the Inca's handiwork. This is due to the perfection of the cuts and location of the stones. Return to the hotel for Lunch Pm Half-day tours-excursion, visiting: Ahu Akivi, the big platform, which is composed of 7 Moais, all of them facing

the sea; the Ana Tepahu caverns; the quarry of Puna Pau, where the top part of the Moais were sculpted and Ahu Tahai. Return to the hotel. Overnight.



Day 4: Hanga Roa

Breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to Mataverí Airport at the arranged time for the departure flight
